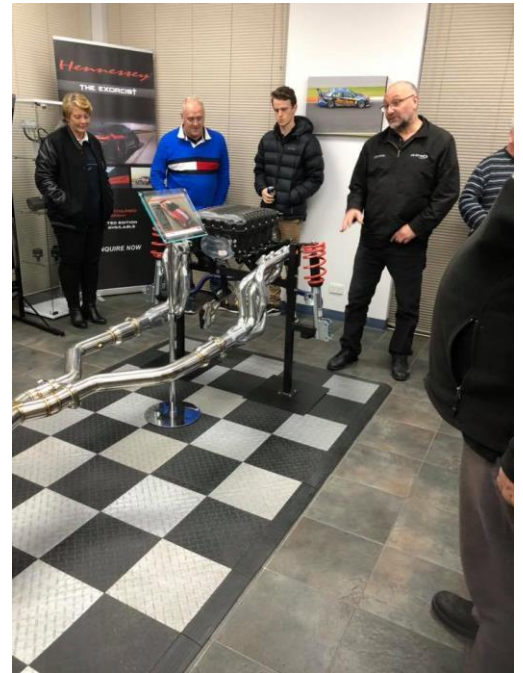
KPM Trade Night – 4th September Hosted by Chris Field

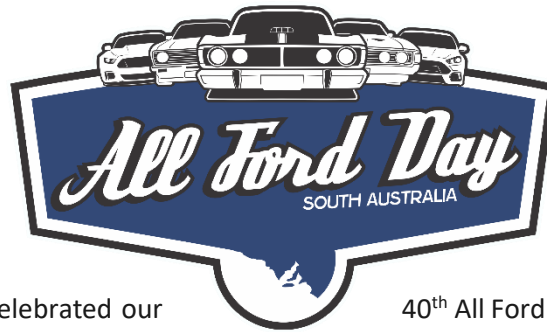

All Ford Day South Australia celebrated our 40th All Ford Day event this year. Along with the 40th anniversary, we also celebrated the transition from steel bumpers to plastic bumpers. This transition is marked by the change from the XC to the XD model Falcons.

This year we returned to the same great venue at Bonython Park, which is proving to be very popular location with entrants and visitors. Although the weather was not in our favor this year, with a few showers in the morning, the event still ran successfully and was a great day to celebrate all things Ford.

The 2019 event saw pre-entries increase to just under 400, with an additional 20 late entries on the day.
