Unfortunately, the weather predictions were not favourable in the lead up to the event. However, due to the number of interstate entrants we had to push to proceed with the event as planned.

We had great support from the club over the weekend with many staying up in Hahndorf to assist. The day started off with decent weather but with predictions set to change we had a number of entrants choose to stay home. We managed to get through judging before the rain started to fall. After 2 hours of heavy rain fall (11mm at the event), we decided to hold the trophy ceremony early so we could let everyone head home. The grounds proved a little difficult for some to navigate leaving, with multiple vehicles requiring tows. Luckily, we had Alex's team of volunteers at the ready with 4x4's and

tow ropes to assist spectators and entrants get home safely. Even with the weather we were still able to make good profits and ensured that we could still donate over \$4000 to our charities. A significant milestone this year was the retirement of the Model A club. After having been one of the original clubs that established All Ford Day SA event over 40 years ago this was the last year with the Model A club participating. Next year we will be the sole organising club with Alex's team of volunteers supporting on behalf of charity organisations.
